

SU Widening Participation Officer

Short Description:

You will be working with SU Presidents, and SU staff to make sure the universities and SU are continuously working towards widening participation at university

Status: Part-Time Officer

Elected: By secret ballot by all Falmouth and Exeter students

Term of Office: 1 Academic Year

Accountable to: The student body via SU Board of Trustees, SU

Student Council, Annual General Meeting and Union General Meetings

Member of/attends: SU Student Council (twice a term)

Liberation Committee (monthly)

1:1 with SU Preident Welfare & Inclusivity (twice termly)

Regular updates with SU Student Voice team

Other groups or meetings as appropriate and mandated

Hours: As the role requires and can be flexible dependent on studies.

Remuneration: This is a voluntary role, however, out of pocket expenses will be paid

where appropriate.

Role Summary:

- To represent and campaign on students' interests with particular regard to widening participation;
- To represent students often under-represented or hard-to-reach and specifically parttime, international, postgraduate, distance-learning and mature students;
- To work closely with the SU Presidents and the Student Voice team in ensuring the universities and SU are continuously working towards widening participation at university.

Responsibilities:

- 1. To attend any meetings required by the role;
- 2. To represent the student view and experience when reviewing/monitoring delivery of the Access Agreements with Falmouth University and University of Exeter and ensure as many students as possible are consulted;
- 3. To promote widening student participation to all students;
- 4. To consult with students often under-represented in the students' union and specifically part-time, international, postgraduate, distance-learning and mature students;
- 5. To bring widening student participation issues to the Liberation Committee;
- 6. To liaise with SU Societies relevant to the role;
- 7. To represent the student view and student experience in your work with the universities in encouraging students from all backgrounds to come to university;
- 8. To represent the student view and experience in the planning of the next Welcome Week for Freshers programme, particularly ensuring widening participation is taken into consideration:
- 9. To work with the SU team and relevant societies to submit proposals to the Student Council which enhances the widening participation agenda.
- 10. To manage and report on any budgets received in line with SU procedures.

General Duties:

- 1. To undertake training as required to fulfil your role;
- 2. To conduct yourself appropriately as a public representative of students and SU.
- 3. To make yourself known to the students you represent;
- 4. To effectively communicate information and plans with relevant members of the SU team;
- 5. Ensure that SU policies and procedures are adhered to at all times, and where appropriate, make recommendations and contribute to the amendment or development of a policy;
- 6. Carry out duties within the scope of the role as set out in the SU Constitution & By-laws or as mandated by the SU Board of Trustees, SU Student Council, Referenda and General Meetings;
- 7. To regularly provide a written report to the SU Student Council on duties undertaken;
- 8. To promote SU and student involvement in line with SU branding and marketing guidelines;
- 9. To deliver a handover for your successor
