1	Welcome and introduction	The Forum Chair opened the meeting by welcoming all attendees and outlining the ground rules for discussion and voting.	JM
2	Exec Proposal Discussion Voting	<b>Timetables That Work: Enhancing Student Success Through Fair and Accessible Scheduling</b>  <b>Background/Presentation Summary:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Getting started survey - heard from students who worked alongside their studies</li><li>Looked at timetable efficiency and not having long back-to-back blocks</li><li>Ensure resources e.g. lecture recordings are easily accessible</li></ul> <b>Discussion points:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Joint lecture and seminars</li><li>Cut off time for lectures for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> years living off campus (e.g. not past 4pm)</li><li>More consistency with timetabling</li></ul> <b>Voting outcome:</b> No voting at this stage, presented for feedback only. 3 and 4	Make a Change proposals	<b>Wider availability of sanitary products for isolated facilities</b> <p><b>Background/Presentation Summary:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Access to essential sanitary products is a fundamental part of ensuring student wellbeing, dignity, and comfort.</li> <li>Architecture SSLG had raised concerns about the lack of sanitary supplies available in the Kathmor studio space, an isolated learning facility where students often spend long hours.</li> <li>FXPlus stated that products are available elsewhere on campus, but Forum agreed it is unreasonable to expect students to leave their learning environment, cross car parks and main roads, and search across campus for necessities.</li> </ul> <p><b>Discussion points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It was started as an SU initiative which FXPlus took on to set up provision across campus. JL reported that recent conversations have been had between the SU and FXPlus and discussions are in a good place to move this forward.</li> <li>This issue extends beyond one department. Many isolated learning spaces across Falmouth and Exeter campuses face similar challenges, leaving students without accessible, emergency sanitary provisions.</li> </ul> <p><b>Voting Outcome:</b></p> <p>Voted as an agreed action, unanimous (7)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This proposal was voted through as an Agreed Action as the provision of sanitary products is an existing scheme across campuses, and this would be focusing on enhancing/expanding the existing provision.</li> </ul>	JL

		<p><b>Significantly reduce laundry prices at falmouth/exeter university</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To significantly reduce the pricing of laundry or completely replace Circuit-GO with a better alternative.</li> <li>• Circuit-GO reportedly made £3.2 million in profit in 2022 alone, the previous year they made £3.9 million. Doing your laundry shouldn't be a privilege, it should be a necessity. For the amount we pay for accommodation, I think we all deserve the right to (at the very least) have (significantly) cheaper pricing for our wash loads.</li> <li>• This would help students' cost of living to be quite a bit easier.</li> </ul> <p><b>Discussion Points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discussion centred around quality of service alongside cost, that machines were often out of service/broken and that the machines are outdated.</li> <li>• Suggestions made to reduce cost: costs of laundry could be included in the price of accommodation . Set the price of laundry included in accommodation fees. A laundry plan: £20 a week or month for unlimited washing.</li> </ul> <p><b>Voting outcome:</b> Voting as a Union Priority (6 for, 1 against)</p>
